Monthly Recap

Steve Zuehlke volunteered to lead Magic 101. The theme was "No Ropes, No Cards." He prepared a packet for all the participants which included props and directions for several magic effects. The packet included a Hypercard that he made for everyone. He shared how to do the following effects—cup levitation trick, magnetic hand trick, two crayon ESP, wall paper gag, pocket full of change effect, etc. He also prepared written directions for a Simple Book Test. This Book Test could be used with any book. He recommended to use books that were less than 300 pages. Everyone really liked this effect since it was easy to learn and also mind-boggling. The members really enjoyed Steve's presentation. Everyone had a pamphlet filled with easy magic effects that did not involve ropes or cards. Steve shared that he and his wife will be presenting a lecture during Magic 101 at Ring 1's November meeting. He shared that his wife is a crafter and needs members to RSVP in order to have enough materials for everyone who attends.



Also, Dan Harlan will be the featured performer. The December meeting will again include the annual White Elephant Gift Exchange. The gifts need to be wrapped and consist of a working magic trick or effect. He also reminded members that the annual Veterans and First Responder Magical Holiday Show will take place on December 8th . Terry requested that members contact him if they are willing to volunteer at the show. This year the cost will be \$5. D. Jay reminded the members that he still needs a few volunteers to perform at the monthly visits to Shriners Hospital.

Terry Richison led the "magic" part of the meeting which was titled "Go to Trick". He recruited volunteers to share effects they always have available and are ready to perform when someone asks "show me a trick." Dave Goldfarb performed two card tricks. Dave regularly attends meetings but this is the first time he has performed in front of the group. He did an excellent job! Kevin Smith performed a card trick; however, he explained, that it was more like an experiment. He called this effect the "Art of B'Wavery". He was able to guess a volunteer's card even though the card was imaginary. Hal Scharf also performed a card trick. Chuck Levy told a detective story using cards. He even dressed and talked like two famous detectives. He explained that he has used this effect in his lectures. The members felt his story was very entertaining. D. Jay performed an effect that Ray Belz had made for him. It consisted of a card cut a certain way. He told a story to go along with the movement of the card. Jeff Marcus, a magician from California, was in town and attended Ring 1's meeting. He did several effects using rubber bands. He explained that rubber band effects can be performed anywhere. He also did several coin effects in which coins appeared and disappeared. The Ring always welcomes visitors to its meetings. Steve Bender (Ickle Pickle Products) performed an effect entitled "Perfect Match." He gave a volunteer a stack of cards and he had a stack of cards. The volunteer shuffled her cards and then each of them turned over a card. Amazingly, each time, the cards matched. Steve Buesking also performed a card trick. He had a volunteer choose a card and put it back in the deck. He used the Kings in the deck to find the chosen card. Keith Smith performed an effect in which he used a dice he made which had different beer labels on the sides. He had a volunteer put her hand on the dice and he was able to tell which side was face up. Romero Nestor performed a coin trick in which the coin disappeared. Henry Schaper and John Davit both performed card tricks. Both of these longtime members really do a good job with cards. Steve Bender performed another effect which was in his "pickle case." He had four cards and he was able to change them into different cards several times. Terry Richison asked a volunteer for a hundred-dollar bill. He amazingly changed it into a dollar bill. Kevin Smith performed a card trick entitled "Second Chance" by Wayne Dobson. He had two card decks—one red and one blue. He had someone pick a card in one deck

and he was able to find the same card in the other deck. Sister Michael Therese used a fifty-cent piece and was able to make it appear and disappear. Gary Chan also performed a card trick in which he was able to find a person's chosen card. Steve Zuehlke was the last performer. He told a story "Little Joe" that went with the cards he turned over in the card deck. It was very clever and entertaining.




Veteran's Show

Submit Articles for the SPIRIT


