## What's Going On

It has been an interesting month. The August meeting date has changed; that information is at the end of this piece.

The initial outcomes from your survey responses are:

1. Members want lectures.
2. Members want to learn new material; and
3. Members prefer entertaining meetings, including a workshop approach to learning a single effect.

**Financial Review:** I spent several hours with Sandy Weis and Darrell Lenz reviewing our financial situation. The good news: We have sufficient cash for several years to support ourselves.

The bad news: We are spending more than we bring in. Last year, the club had a \$650 loss. Our biggest expense this past year was the \$825 room rental paid to the Creve Coeur Rec Center. If we could find a lower cost alternative, we could afford more lectures without tapping our cash reserves.

The St. Louis County Library system has meeting rooms that are free and centrally located, but there is no guarantee on booking rooms. We are looking for alternatives; all suggestions are welcome.

Similarly, dues has not changed in decades. If we raise dues to \$20 per year, our projected income will be positive but less than the cost of a lecture.

Aside from spending our reserve, we have another idea: The Ring is going to do two shows, one at 2pm (to be confirmed) and one at 7pm (to be confirmed), on October 22. This is traditionally Magic Week - the week preceding Halloween; ok, we're a couple days early, but close enough. The shows will be at the Florissant Civic Center. The theatre holds about 450. Here are the lineups (not in performance order):

**Afternoon show:** Jeff Lefton, Marty Kopp, Tom Reily, John Johnson, Columbus Smith with Steve Corbitt as emcee. Jimmy 'Cards' Molinari in lobby.

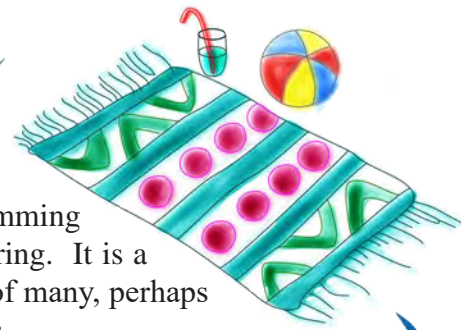
**Evening show:** Jeff Lefton, Marty Kopp, Tom Reily, John Johnson, Gary S. Chan with Steve Corbitt as emcee. Jimmy 'Cards' Molinari in lobby.

The goal is to hit 400 backsides in the seats. If we do that, we will cover our future needs for the next four or five years. Social media will be used, plus posters in the Florissant schools and community college. If you could post the show information to your friends and family via social media - i.e. Facebook, Instagram, etc., it would be a help. Buying a couple of tickets, dragging an in-law or two as well, would help.





It's simple:. The better we do, the better the programming for all of us. All performers and tech are volunteering. It is a talented group, so I hope you will join in the efforts of many, perhaps volunteer for back stage helpers for one or both shows.



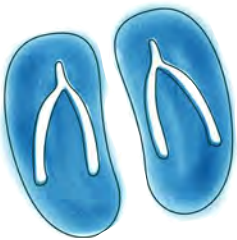

# Ring 1 Report

Ring 1 does not meet in July. However, the Board still meets in July and has been busy planning for the 2022-2023 year. Also, individual committees have met this summer and will propose ideas, changes, etc. to the Board for consideration. Steve Buesking, the incoming president, has already spent countless hours preparing for the upcoming year. He is very organized, is creative, and has innovative ideas. The Ring hopes to recruit younger magicians in order for Ring 1 to continue to be one of the “top” magic clubs.

Recently, Jill “Silly Jilly the Clown” Schmidt broke her wrist during a performance. KinderCare booked her to first do a magic show, and that went great. When making balloon animals, she lifted her foot back, and her heel touched the back of her opposite leg. Silly Jilly’s heel went underneath the hem of her wide gauchos. When she put her foot down, her heel pulled down on the pants and caused her to fall backward. She caught herself with her hand, which resulted in her breaking her wrist. All the students were watching and were eagerly awaiting their balloon animal. A teacher gave Silly Jilly a ride to urgent care. Silly Jilly’s husband went to KinderCare about an hour later to pick up her magic, and the students were making Silly Jilly Get Well Cards. The doctor says it will be at least seven weeks until Silly Jilly can make balloon animals. But she is happy she can still perform magic shows and even perform her whole show. She does not do sleight of hand; mainly does easy tricks, for example, a change bag and a stratosphere-like trick. However, her husband needs to reset her spring snake fountain every time she uses it. Three days after she broke her wrist, she performed her first one-armed magic show. It was a big hit, and Brussels, Illinois, has already re-booked her for their 2023 festival. The Ring hopes Silly Jilly has a speedy recovery!



Dan Todd, D. Jay Lenz, and Steve Buesking restarted Project Magic in St. Louis Post-COVID. The Ranken Jordan Pediatric Bridge Hospital staff and 20+ children were treated to Dan and D. Jay’s performance. (“Steve, not so much” per Steve but the Ring knows that Steve was a real asset to the performance. :) The hospital did have the standard restrictions: No fire effects - fire doesn’t play well with oxygen tanks - and no Latex - see rubber band packaging. In the post-COVID era, no direct contact with the children was allowed. The children and staff were held 15 feet away from the stage. Any effect that required audience participation would be handled by a single masked and gloved staff member. If the Magi was to interact with the staff member, they would need to be masked. As the children are in Ranken Jordan for one to twelve months, some mobile, some confined to their hospital bed, the distraction was welcomed. The children applauded, laughed, and raised their voices on cue. There were smiles from staff and children throughout. The Ring is scheduled to perform monthly, on the second Monday of each month for one hour. In prior years, the Project Magic magis would hand out the props and teach a trick for those props to the children after the performance. The inability to hand anything to a child, for the child’s protection, will be limiting that ability. Should anyone have suggestions, Ring One would love to hear them.

Dan Todd has been quite busy. He performs magic on CCTV at St. Louis Children's Hospital. He also performs live for the kids in Children's Hospital's behavioral unit and also performs closeup for the Children's Playroom Holiday carnival activities. Dan is bringing joy to the patients at Children's.

As a reminder to all, the St. Louis Magic Roundtable meets every Saturday at 1:30pm at the Dierbergs on Lindemann and Manchester. We have had one new person join us each of the last three weeks. And this past Saturday, there were 17 people at the Roundtable, including Chris Korn who was here from LA. It was really fun. All were visiting, and many were performing. ## Card Corner: The Love Ritual

The following effect is a great use for old cards. Four cards are used by the Magi and each audience member. (The author's suggested patter for each step is in parentheses.)

Source: A book in English by Woody Aragon, page 25

Are you lucky in love? No. Let's do the Love ritual. This ritual will guarantee you one week's worth of love.

1. Any four cards will do, but they must all be different faces.
2. Pickup all the cards by the long edge, thumbs on the faces, and tear the cards in half. (Just like the hearts of a breaking couple are torn in half...just like they tear their pictures in two ..it's rather symbolic)
3. (Now place either the left hand pieces atop the right, or the right hand pieces atop the left, that's the thing about love...it doesn't care if you are left or right.)
4. (Now you have a small deck of cards. Cut, then complete the cut. When a couple breaks up, they're 'cutting' their bond.)
5. (Make a small fan with the cards, take the top 3 pieces and insert them into the middle of the fan.)
6. (Square everything. Without looking, take the top piece and place it in your wallet or pocket. That is something lovers do, they carry a picture of their love ones near their heart. Mushy, isn't it? But true nevertheless.)
7. (Make a fan one more time. Take the upper piece and lose it in the middle of the fan Do it one more time with the top two pieces of you wish. Do it once again if you feel like it or not. This is what happens when men try to understand women, they always end up lost.)
8. (Let's make this more complicated - such is love. Take the top one, two, or three pieces...you can lose them in the middle or throw them away. No one can know how many pieces are in your hand now )
9. (Due to all that shuffling, cutting, losing pieces in the middle, maybe throwing pieces away, it has become a total Mess. That's the way men are. And women really hate it. They say they must put order to our mess, many couples argue about this kind of stuff.)
10. (Let's get ready for a week of love. Take the top piece and move it to the bottom as you say 'Sunday', 'monday', and so on, one by on until you finish with Saturday.)
11. (So the week ends with broken, cut, shuffled, lost and messy relationships. And I get the only

thing that can make us remember true love is the picture of our loved ones, safe in our heart. We could always pluck a Daisy...she loves me, she loves me not ..let's do that.)

12. Take the first piece, put it to the bottom, and say "She loves me", grab the second one. That corresponds to 'she loves me not' right? Throw that one away from you! We don't want those who do not love us nearby do we?

13. Repeat the ritual, passing a piece to the bottom on she loves me, and throwing away the pieces on 'she loves me not'.

14. (You will end up with one piece in your hand. Take the one you set aside at the beginning. They match! It is the power of love. Cupid did it again! Isn't it wonderful.)

## Coin Transposition

Equipment:

- Two identical coins with a distinct front and back. For the purposes of illustration, we'll assume that each coin has a silver side and a copper back.
- A see-through glass that won't shatter easily. DO NOT use the family China or any glassware that has sentimental value to a family member on the off chance of breakage.
- Optionally, a magician's mat on top of the table.

Effect: Tell the spectator that you have one silver coin and one copper coin, showing the silver side of one coin and copper side of another coin. (The spectator does not know that each coin has a copper side and a silver side.) Put one coin, silver side up, onto the mat (or table). Put an upside-down glass over the coin. Put the other coin, copper side up, into one palm so that the spectator can see the copper coin in your hand. Close your hand into a fist, and turn it upside down. Open your fist and simultaneously gently slam the hand with the coin onto the glass. Show that the coin inside of the cup is now copper and the coin on top of the glass is silver. The coins have miraculously switched places!

Secrets:

- When you turn your fist over and open your hand, that flips the coin to the other side.
- When you put the upside-down glass over the coin, put the edge of the glass on the edge of the coin (with most of the coin inside of the glass). Assuming the spectator is directly across from you, they should not be able to tell from the front that the glass is teetering on the coin. When you gently slam your hand onto the glass, the force will flip the coin inside of the glass, thereby showing the other side of the coin.
