




Board members (left to right): Steve Finkelstein, Alan Zibits, Sandy Weis, D. Jay Lenz, Mike McClure, Scott Smith.

Lunch" principle, with Matthew's advertising information on it which is left with the
spectator. A great give-away piece! Matthew shared several other commercial routines which
were available in his notes. The real highlight of the evening was Matthew's work with the



On October 6th I performed at St. Louis Children's Hospital's on CCTV my Barbie Levitation, my large version of EMPTY, Slydini Silks, Six Bill Repeat, Reading (coloring) Book, my Grandma's Pearl Necklace, Bubble Catch, and Square Circle with a chirping bird in a cage. I ordered the Moon Box by TCC & Conan Liu & Royce Luo. I hope it is well made. It is a wooden square version of a 'Chick Pan' that can hold two decks of cards or a load such as liquid, if needed! 
