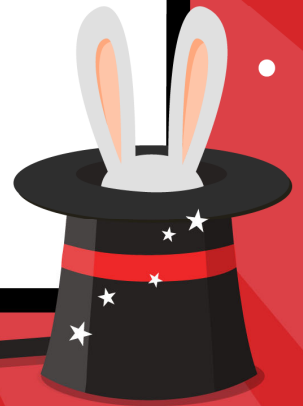




Monthly Recap

ABOUT Olivia...



Olivia Leigh (age 9), daughter of John and Nicholle Leigh, is the youngest of four, a bright-eyed bundle of energy and curiosity with a joy-filled enthusiasm and fascination with the many wonders of life (and a smile that won't quit!)

On May 26, following a battery of tests to determine the cause of an April seizure on her way home from golf practice, Olivia's family was informed by the Department of Neurology at Children's Hospital in St. Louis, that she had a "lesion in her brain that would need to be surgically removed." And just like that, everything changed. The old routine for the Leigh family of 'comfortable' and 'safe' would be replaced by a new routine of 'uncertainty' and 'fear'.

Bolstered by a strong family and a strong faith, surgery would be 10 days later, on May 30, and though scary, it would be a successful procedure, except that the terminology suddenly changed, with the 'lesion' now referred to as a 'tumor'. Olivia bounced back with flying colors, while the family anxiously awaited the pathology report on the tumor. Mom Nicholle, describes how her "heart sank" when the neurology team set up for them an appointment with 'oncology' — another unwanted addition to the Leigh family vocabulary. An agonizing fourteen days later, on June 13, the report came back with a diagnosis of Anaplastic Ependymoma — cancer of the brain and central nervous system, grade 3.

A followup MRI and spinal tap on July 5 brought some much-needed good news in this one-step-at-a-time, roller coaster ride of a journey: Olivia's spinal cord was clear of malignancy, which would allow for Olivia (Livi) to begin a 6-week regimen of radiation therapy (every day except weekends and holidays).

And so the battle continues, but not without hope, not without confidence. Says her mom, "She's my hero and strongest little bird I know. She handles her journey with grace and determination, taking every step in stride. One foot in front of the other!"

Olivia Leigh Fundraiser

The Ring has been asked by a friend of Jenny Jones, who is hosting a fundraiser, on Sept 14th, for a child with brain cancer. They wanted to know if we had anyone who would volunteer to do some balloon twisting or magic or both. The event is from 2pm -10pm. Balloon twisting could be done anytime during the event for as little or long as you wanted. The magic could be walk around or a stand up show. If you were to do walk around, it could be anytime during the event. If you wanted to do a stand up show, you would just need to let them know when you could do your show. They expect to have a lot of kids due to the age of the child with cancer. You don't have to do balloons and magic, so it could be a couple of people doing different types of entertainment.

On June 7, 2019, **Henry Schaper** performed a Card Magic Show for the campers at the Gateway Hemophilia Association, Camp Notacloamoungus. It was held at Camp Wyman, which is located in Eureka, Missouri. The campers were given the opportunity to learn how to take care of themselves in a safe environment and also have a great time, enjoying the outdoors and meeting new friends. The goal is to have the campers return yearly until they are at the age they can become a counselor. The theme this year was the “Wild West.” Henry began by showing the campers different types of card shuffling. He then did several tricks using cards. The children and the counselors in attendance really enjoyed his presentation. The trick that was everyone’s favorite was the following: He had a volunteer deal three stacks of three cards each. The volunteer was shown one of the cards on the bottom. The stacks were then placed on top of each other. Henry then laid the cards down while he counted. Then he dealt out the cards again into three stacks. The two end stacks were removed. The cards in the middle stack were dealt out into three stacks. The two end stacks were removed. The middle card was the card the volunteer was told to remember at the beginning of the effect. He also performed “Any Card at Any Number” which was featured in the February 2016 issue of the “Linking Ring.”

A Treatise on Card Tricks


Card Tricks, Card Tricks and More Card Tricks !!!!! First, let me say, I have nothing against card tricks. I love card tricks. I do more card tricks than anything else. I own more books on card magic than any other subject. Cards are cheap, easy to carry and you get fifty-two in a box. What a deal. But there are good tricks, great tricks and tricks that just plain suck. Pardon my French. There are more trick decks available than ever before. And there are nothing wrong with trick decks. You can accomplish some real miracles. But using two, three or four trick decks in the same set is WRONG. You have to know when to say when. And unfortunately most of us don't when to quit. Imagine what a spectator thinks when you do three different card tricks with three different decks? Now if you want to do a simple deck switch, that is another story.

With all the You Tube videos available, everybody knows at least a few card tricks. Make sure your magic stands out from the rest!

And if using trick cards, try to incorporate them into your regular deck. The reason Bro. John's magic looked so magical was that he incorporated his gaffs into his deck. Nobody ever thought he was using trick cards.

Again, there are more packet tricks available than ever before. Unless the cards are specialty printed (ie something other than a suited card), stay away from these effects UNLESS you are only doing that particular ONE trick for your set. Never mix two different effects using trick cards. It is a dead give way to your spectators that the cards are not normal.

Card Tricks, Card Tricks and More Card Tricks !!!! Last month we talked about card tricks. I love card tricks BUT there are other close up



miracles to be performed. Ropes, sticks, wands, sponge balls, rings, coins, crystals, cups, strings, silks, lighters, cookies, popcorn, matches, gum, paper, pencils, pens, knives and host of other items that can be used for close up. A few good books to pickup would be any of the Fulves Self Working Series, Anything by Bill Severn, Mark Wilson's Course in Magic, Now You See It/ Now You Don't Volumes ONE and TWO, anything by Ganson and Encyclopedia of Close Up Magic by Gibson..... just to name a few. Try working on something other than cards and when asked to perform at the next meeting, blow everyone away by NOT BEING THE CARD GUY.
