Picking up an often used maneuver from the 1860s, Steve will explain how the Paddle Move, and its variations (ie: hot rods, color-changing knives) have remained a staple in most magicians' repertoire. The enigmatic Sponge Ball routine will be discussed if time allows.

Everyone in attendance will take home free samples of the Paddle Move, and a set of two Sponge Balls. Cookies, candy, chips and drinks will be provided for free as always, so there really is no reason to miss our first gathering of the New Year! As Copperfield gracefully bowed out from the stage, we left Las Vegas with cherished memories of adventure, laughter, and the enduring magic that lingers in the city's vibrant atmosphere." 
